#### VISION

#### COUNSELING DEPARTMENT MISSION

The Decatur High School counseling program emphasizes access, and success by implementing a data informed counseling program which inspires all students to grow and develop as learners, thinkers, and inquirers. This is accomplished through meaningful, motivating, and rewarding experiences which are facilitated by highly qualified, caring adults in a safe, supportive, and inviting environment that provide resources and remove barriers to help all students achieve their highest potential and prepare for career, college, and life.

#### SCHOOL

Decatur High School is a comprehensive public high school located in Decatur, Georgia, an urban community of 25,000 residents situated approximately five miles east of downtown Atlanta. Decatur is part of an independent school district within DeKalb County and serves over 5500 students.

DHS is an IB World School in which all students participate in the IB Middle Years Program and most take at least one IB Diploma course. The school offers both the IB Diploma Program and the IB Career Program for 11th/12th graders. All of these IB courses are two-year courses, so many of our students will take college-level IB exams at the end of the senior year, rather than separate exams at the end of the junior and senior years.

Decatur High School operates on a schedule that allows each senior to earn up to 28 Carnegie units toward graduation. Students are required to complete a minimum of 25 units. In addition to our college preparatory courses, students have the opportunity to supplement their curriculum with Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate Diploma courses, Dual Enrollment courses at nearby colleges, internships, and work-study options. For 2024-25, DHS Class of 2025 will have 107 full IB Diploma Program and 50 IB Career Program Candidates, with over 50 additional seniors taking IB exams. Over 100 students are taking dual enrollment courses.

# **ENROLLMENT NOTES**

Students begin IB coursework in their junior year (with the exception of IB Chemistry, which students may start in their sophomore year if qualified)

9th graders may NOT take IB courses. 10th graders may NOT take IB Higher Level (HL) courses.

11th graders may ONLY take up to 2 Standard Level (SL) exams during their junior year, all other exams MUST be taken senior year.

Honors and AP courses have open enrollment. Valedictorian - Student with the highest weighted GPA (selected in spring) Salutatorian - Student with the second highest weighted GPA (selected in spring)
