Homework

- Reading- Students should read 25-30 minutes each night. Please provide a quiet place for them to read. Teachers may provide specific reading tasks that support grade level content.
- Word Study/Spelling- Practice activities twice a week .
- Math-2 to 4 times per week for 20-30 minutes of time at home.
- Social Studies/Science- assignments not completed in class may be sent home; study guides for tests.
- We encourage students to complete homework independently, knowing that mistakes are okay.

Support Services

ESS-Exceptional Student Services

• Comprehensive programs and services for students with special learning needs. Program specialists work with classroom teachers to provide systematically designed instruction.

Gifted Services-LINKS

• LINKS symbolizes the extra links or connections that a gifted student needs to make the chain of their educational experiences meaningful.

Early Intervention Program (EIP)

• Students not performing or maintaining academic grade level skills may qualify for support services to assist with reaching grade level performance.

Limited English Proficient (LEP)

 English Learners (EL) whose native/first/dominant language is not English are eligible for ESOL services

Speech/Language Services

• Speech/Language Pathologists provide individual instruction to identified students
