In The Classroom

As the Title I Teacher, I will:

- Send home specific targeted skill activities based on student individual needs as needed.
- List common math and reading links for parents to review at home with their child on the school Title I web-page and in communication folders monthly.

- Have students set individual learning goals and track their progress.

At Home

As the Family/Parent/Guardian, I will:

- 1. Read with my child or listen to them read everyday and together discuss how the story or text connects to them or the world around them.
- 2. Have my child to participate in math related tasks with me or a family member such as, measuring ingredients for a recipe, counting change at the grocery store, counting down time to a special day (weeks, days, and/or hours), or estimating the daily temperature at home on a regular basis.
- 3. Visit the CL Title I webpage for math and reading strategies and resource links to practice at home with my child. Try emailed parenting tips from the Parent Institute.
- 4. When possible, attend Parent/Family/ Guardian workshops on instructional strategies to be used at home.

As the student, I will:

- 1. Share my learning progress with my parents and family and teachers on a regular basis.
- 2. Practice my targeted math and/or reading skills: computation, measuring, phonics, fluency, comprehension, etc. daily at school and at home.
- 3. Demonstrate CREW (collaboration, responsibility, engagement and we show respect) while completing assigned tasks at school and at home.
