The American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act was signed into law on March 11, 2021. This law provides a \$1.9 trillion package of assistance measures, including \$122 billion for the ARP Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ARP ESSER) Fund.

Funds are provided to State educational agencies and school districts to help safely reopen and sustain the safe operation of schools and address the impact of the coronavirus pandemic on the Nation's students.

A school district may use ARP ESSER funds for a wide variety of activities related to educating students during the COVID19 pandemic and addressing the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on students and educators. Key areas defined by the USED are:

- address the academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs of students
- activities that are necessary to maintain the operation of services such as to stabilize the workforce and avoid layoffs
- at least 20 percent of the funds must be used to measure and address the academic impact of lost instructional time on all students, through the implementation of evidence-based interventions, such as summer learning or summer enrichment, extended day, comprehensive after school programs, or extended school year programs
