


What's working? What needs improvement?

## Five Essential Components of Reading

- **Phonemic Awareness**: Recognizing and using individual sounds to create words.
- **Phonics**: Realizing the relationship between written letters and spoken sounds.
- **Fluency**: Developing the ability to read a sentence, paragraph or text accurately and quickly.
- **Vocabulary**: Learning the meaning of words by themselves and in sentences along with their pronunciation.
- **Comprehension**: Understanding what sentences, paragraphs, and stories are trying to tell us. Making sense of what we hear and read.

## What is Fluency?

The term 'fluency' is used to describe a reader's ability to read accurately, at an appropriate pace and with expression. **Reading fluently** helps children understand what they are reading. These tips can help you model fluent reading and help your child practice reading fluently.

# Simple View of Reading




$$0 \times 1 = 0$$


$$1 \times 0 = 0$$

A great way to increase your child's vocabulary is to read with them and to engage in conversations with them.






## What is Reading Comprehension?



**Reading comprehension** refers to children's ability to understand what they read. Reading is all about making meaning. When young children are learning to read, they need to do more than just sound out the words to make meaning. Reading comprehension involves thinking about a book and fully understanding the story or information.



