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

Five Essential Components of Reading

- **Phonemic Awareness**: Recognizing and using individual sounds to create words.
- **Phonics**: Realizing the relationship between written letters and spoken sounds.
- **Fluency**: Developing the ability to read a sentence, paragraph or text accurately and quickly.
- **Vocabulary**: Learning the meaning of words by themselves and in sentences along with their pronunciation.
- **Comprehension**: Understanding what sentences, paragraphs, and stories are trying to tell us. Making sense of what we hear and read.

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What is Fluency?

The term 'fluency' is used to describe a reader's ability to read accurately, at an appropriate pace and with expression. **Reading fluently** helps children understand what they are reading. These tips can help you model fluent reading and help your child practice reading fluently.

Tips For Building Fluency

- Read aloud to children to provide a model of fluent reading
- Have children listen and follow along with audio recordings

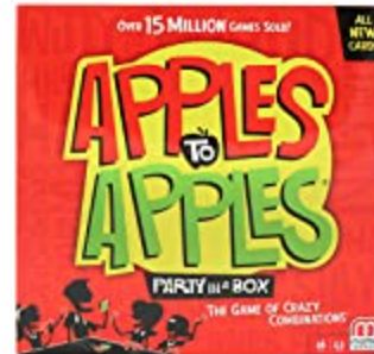
A great way to increase your child's vocabulary is to read with them and to engage in conversations with them.

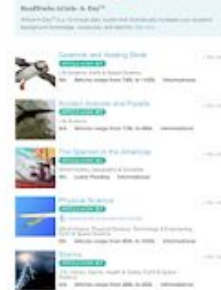

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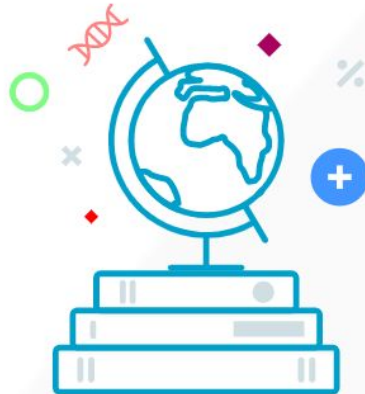

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
