Five Components of Reading

Five Essential Components of Reading

- <u>Phonemic Awareness</u>: Recognizing and using individual sounds to create words.
- <u>Phonics</u>: Realizing the relationship between written letters and spoken sounds.
- Fluency: Developing the ability to read a sentence, paragraph or text accurately and quickly.
- Vocabulary: Learning the meaning of words by themselves and in sentences along with their pronunciation.
- <u>Comprehension</u>: Understanding what sentences, paragraphs, and stories are trying to tell us. Making sense of what we hear and read.


What is Fluency?

The term 'fluency' is used to describe a reader's ability to read accurately, at an appropriate pace and with expression. **Reading fluently** helps children understand what they are reading. These tips can help you model fluent reading and help your child practice reading fluently.


Tips For Building Fluency


Comprehension

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
