VACCINATIONS

Staying up to date on routine vaccinations is essential to prevent illness from many different infections. For COVID-19, <u>staying</u> <u>up to date with COVID-19 vaccinations</u> is the leading public health strategy to prevent severe disease.



STAY HOME WHEN SICK

People with symptoms of infectious diseases, including COVID-19, influenza, respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), and gastrointestinal infections, should stay home and get tested for COVID-19.

Staying home when sick can lower the risk of spreading infectious diseases.



CLEANING AND DISINFECTION

CSD will frequently clean surfaces to reduce the risk of germs spreading by touching surfaces.



VENTILATION SYSTEMS

CSD will optimize ventilation and improve indoor air quality to reduce the risk of germs and contaminants spreading through the air.

Outdoor lunch is not a mitigation strategy being used in CSD.



HAND HYGIENE / RESPIRATORY ETIQUETTE

Washing hands can prevent the spread of infectious diseases. CSD will teach and reinforce proper handwashing to lower the risk of spreading viruses. School staff will provide adequate hand washing supplies and opportunities for handwashing before and after lunch. Additional hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol will be placed throughout each building. CSD will also teach and reinforce respiratory etiquette.



ISOLATION

CSD will follow <u>isolation</u> guidelines as outlined by the CDC.



DIAGNOSTIC TESTING / POINT OF CARE TESTING

Diagnostic Testing is intended to identify current infection in individuals and should be performed on anyone that has signs and symptoms consistent with COVID-19 and/or following recent known or suspected exposure.



NOTIFICATION EXPOSURE AND REPORTING

Schools will send communication to parents/guardians and staff who were in a class with an individual who tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 48 hours.

The CSD COVID report will only include selfreported cases.

MASKING*** Wearing a well-fitting mask consistently and correctly reduces the risk of spreading the virus that causes COVID-19. Indoor masking is recommended for all staff, and students, and <u>required for visitors</u>
