
K-12 Total Enrollment October








K-2 Enrollment by School and Grade






K-12 Enrollment by Race

Population by Race PreK - 12th





Preliminary Observations

- Enrollment continues to grow
- Number of students added each year is declining
- Enrollment is up in grades K, 1, 3, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11
- Enrollment is down in grades 2, 4, 5, 7, 12
- Kindergarten numbers are holding steady
- The number of students added at first grade has decreased in the past two years compared to the 4 years prior (39, 28, 26, 27, 12, 22)
